About the Spectrum Project...



The Spectrum Project combines MUSIC, DANCE, DRAMA and ART for children with differing abilities. Productions are created by the ideas of the performers with direction from college students. Each year, the Spectrum Project serves over 60 performers and their families.

The Spectrum Project performers come from the Cedar Valley and range in age from 5 to 19. Performers meet each Saturday beginning in January. For ages, 18-24, there is a Production & Design department.





Each performer is paired with a Spectrum Project Buddy for the whole season. Buddies are UNI, Allen College and Hawkeye Community College students who volunteer each week to work with performers.

Since 2015, the Spectrum Project has provided performing arts experiences for children with differing abilities in the Cedar Valley and now offers singing lessons through a program called *Spectrum Sings!* as well as a rock band of performers called *Spectrum Rocks!*

The Spectrum Project is supported through participating families, the UNI School of Music and community support.
